

# Arkansas State Veteran's Benefits & Discounts

The state of Arkansas provides several veteran benefits. This section offers a brief description of each of the following benefits.

## **Veteran Housing Programs**

### **Fayetteville Veterans Home**

Officials broke ground for the Arkansas State Veterans Home in Fayetteville on Sept. 3, 2004. They welcomed their first resident on June 21, 2006. This licensed Medicaid/Medicare 108 bed skilled care nursing facility, provides a comfortable and supportive atmosphere for our Veterans. It is operated under the direction of the Arkansas Department of Veterans Affairs and has been approved and recognized by the Federal Veterans Administration as a qualified State Veterans Home. A benefit of being a resident of the State Veterans Home is that they provide RN coverage for all three shifts, 24 hours a day. Additionally, they have security personnel on site 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Have a medical need for nursing home placement.

The Fayetteville Veterans Home is located at 1125 North College Avenue, Fayetteville, Arkansas 72703 and can be reached at Tel: (479) 444-7001/695-0184F or email [kathie.j.gately@arkansas.gov](mailto:kathie.j.gately@arkansas.gov). It is a licensed Medicaid/Medicare 108 bed skilled care nursing facility which provides a comfortable and supportive atmosphere for veterans. Criteria for admission is no criminal record, honorable discharge,

and a medical need for nursing home placement. Arkansas residents have first priority. Veteran's spouses and Gold Star parents can apply for admission. A tour of the facility can be arranged upon request prior to submitting an application. The application process:

- Submit DD-214 or Separation Papers, copies of Social Security, Medicare, Medicaid and/or other insurance cards, and written verification of a service-connected disability rating showing the percentage of the disability rating (if applicable).
- A one-on-one interview with the applicant may be conducted by a registered nurse.
- Reviewed by the Admissions Committee of the application, medical history and nurse interview.

The facility provides the following services:

- Hospice and respite care
- Medical Director available and RN, LPN, CNA on-site care around the clock.
- Physical, occupational and speech therapy
- Daily activities coordinated by a Certified Activities Director.
- A Licensed Social Worker
- An Arkansas Department of Veterans Affairs Benefits Officer who assists all veterans with VA Benefits.
- Transportation available, personal laundry done at no additional charge, and security provided 24 hours a day.



If you have a Service Connected Disability (SCD) at 60%, and rated unemployable, or 70% or more, it is possible that the Veterans Administration (VA) would pay for your stay at the Arkansas Veterans Home. The cost per day is \$130.00 for a semi-private room and \$145.00 for a private room. Medications will be billed to the veteran or a responsible party separately from a pharmacy with whom the nursing home is contracted. Your medication will be billed separately to you, or your responsible party, or your prescription drug insurance carrier from a pharmacy with whom the facility is contracted. Only Veterans

already on VA Aid and Attendance compensation can continue to obtain their medication through the VA system. The State Medicaid program pays for medications for all residents receiving nursing home Medicaid. Veterans service groups may request the use of the meeting room or outdoor patio for special events. Use of these areas is at the discretion of the home's administrator. The use of tobacco products are not allowed inside the facility. However, they do allow smoking in the designated area (outside) on the ground floor. Smoking products and lighters are kept in a secure area. They are not allowed in residents rooms.

### **North Little Rock Veterans Home**

Officials broke ground for the Arkansas State Veterans Home at North Little Rock (ASVH-NLR) on July 29, 2015 and is scheduled to open Fall 2016. It is the first Veterans home in Arkansas developed from the ground-up for the sole purpose of long-term care for our Veterans. ASVH-NLR is a “small home” design with eight individual homes that serve 12 residents each. Each resident will have a private room and private bathroom. Less than one percent of long-term care facilities across the nation are built and operated as small homes. The small home concept seeks to de-institutionalize care and provide a warm, home-like environment in a setting that encourages social activity. As a result of the design, the operating model differs substantially from that of a traditional skilled nursing facility. ASVH-NLR is currently not accepting applications for admission. ## **Financial Assistance Benefits**

### **Personal Property Tax Exemption**

Arkansas' disabled veterans who have been awarded special monthly compensation by the Department of Veterans Affairs for the loss of, or the loss of use of, one (1) or more limbs, for total blindness in one (1) or both eyes, or for service-connected one hundred percent (100%) total and permanent disability shall be

exempt from payment of all state taxes on the homestead and personal property owned by the disabled veteran. Surviving spouses, so long as they remain unmarried, and dependent children, during their minority, continue this entitlement. Entitlement is also available if the veteran was killed or died within the scope of his military duties, is missing in action, or died from service connected causes as certified by the Department of Veterans Affairs. If subsequent marriage is terminated, surviving spouse may be reinstated. In all cases, annual re-certification of continued entitlement by the VA is required. ### **Gross Receipt of Tax Exemption**

Gross receipts or proceeds derived from the sale of a new automobile to a veteran who is blind as a result of a service-connected injury. Registration will require an entitlement letter from the VA and will be limited to one new vehicle every two (2) years. This exemption defines automobile as a passenger vehicle or pickup truck but does not include trucks with a maximum gross load in excess of three-quarter (3/4) ton and does not include any trailer.

### **Income Tax Exemption**

Provides an exemption of the first \$9,000.00 of active duty pay or the first \$6,000.00 of retired pay. The exemptions include Reserve and National Guard Components or for retired members who are residents of the State of Arkansas.

## **Education Benefits**

### **Educational Benefits**

Arkansas Department of Higher Education (ADHE) has the authority to provide free tuition and fees at any state supported college, university, technical school, or vocational school; to the wife and children of any Arkansan who has been declared to be Prisoner of War or placed in a missing-in-action status since January 1, 1960. The same provisions apply to the surviving spouse and children of any Arkansas resident killed in action since 1960.

### **In State Tuition**

Regardless of residence, a state-supported institution of higher education, trade schools, or vocational schools shall classify a student as in-state, in-county, in-district, or resident for the purpose of tuition and fees applicable for all programs of study, including distance learning programs, if the student is a:

- (1) Veteran who was discharged or released from a period of not less than ninety (90) days of active duty in the military, naval, or air service within three (3) years before the date of enrollment in a program of study;
- (2) Dependent of a veteran under subdivision (1) of this section;
- (3) A member of the armed forces
- (4) A spouse of a member of the armed forces (AR Code § 6-60-205)

## Other State Veteran Benefits

### Employment

The [Arkansas Department of Workforce Services](#) provides employment counseling and referral services tailored to the special needs of veterans. They also maintain an ongoing program of job development designed to create jobs and preferences for all veterans, through the Local Veterans Employment Representatives (LVER's) and the Disabled Veterans Outreach program (DVOP).

### Diplomas for Veterans

High School Diplomas can be obtained for **WWII veterans** as well as **Korean and Vietnam veterans** who were called up for active duty service before finishing high school. Qualifying veterans should contact their **school superintendent** or the [Arkansas Department of Education](#).

### Arkansas Department of Parks and Tourism

Arkansas resident veterans permanently service connected at a 100% disability rate may camp for half price in Arkansas State Parks. Proof of 100% status is required.

### Arkansas Game and Fish Commission

Resident 3- year Disability Fishing License- RDC (\$10.50) entitles all 100% totally and permanently disabled persons privileges of the Resident Sportsman's License (hunting) and the Resident Fisheries Conservation License (fishing). HIP registration is required to hunt game birds. To hunt waterfowl, state and federal waterfowl stamps are required in addition to HIP. A Trout permit must also be purchased to fish in certain waters. Certification will be accepted from Social Security, Veteran's Affairs or Railroad Retirement. Proof of one year's Arkansas residency is required to apply for this license. Valid for three years from date of purchase, recertification is required for renewal. These two licenses are only available from the Commission's Little Rock office. If you wish to purchase a license, bring proof of one year Arkansas residency, such as driver's licenses, state ID, property assessments, Arkansas state income tax forms and acceptable proof of disability.

### Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Hunting License (\$25)

Entitles totally and permanently disabled veterans the privileges of the Resident Sportsman's License. Annual Harvest Information Program (HIP) registration is required to hunt migratory game birds. To hunt waterfowl, state and federal waterfowl stamps also are required. Veterans must be 100% totally and permanently disabled with certification from the United States Department of Veterans Affairs. Proof of 60 days Arkansas residency is required. This license is available from the AGFC Little Rock office and by mail. Call (800) 364-4263 or (501) 223-6388 in the Little Rock area, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, for details.

### Resident Disabled Military Veteran Lifetime Combination License (\$35.50)

Entitles totally and permanently disabled veterans the privileges of the Resident Sportsman's License (hunting) and the Resident Fisheries Conservation License (fishing). Harvest Information Program (HIP) registration is required to hunt migratory game birds. To hunt waterfowl, state and federal waterfowl stamps are also required. A trout permit must be purchased to fish in certain waters. Veterans must be 100% totally and permanently disabled with certification from the United States Department of Veterans

Affairs. Proof of 60 days Arkansas residency is required. This license is available from the AGFC Little Rock office and by mail. Call (800) 364-4263 or (501) 223-6388 in the Little Rock area, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, for details.

**Resident Military Retiree Lifetime Fishing License (\$10.50)**

Entitles military retirees the privileges of the Resident Fisheries Conservation License. A Resident Trout Permit also must be purchased to retain trout or to fish in certain waters. Military retirees must be 60 years of age or older and provide proof of military retirement (Military ID Card). Proof of 60 days Arkansas residency is required. This license is available from all AGFC Regional Offices and by mail. Call (800) 364-4263 or (501) 223-6300 in the Little Rock area, 8 a.m.-4:30 p.m., Monday-Friday, for details.

**License Plates**

The Revenue Division will provide (upon receipt of proper certification letters) a number of special privileges and benefits for Arkansas residents, including the below 23 military related special license plates. For eligibility, requirements, and fees click on the plate name:

	<p><b>Armed Forces Reserve License Plate</b> Must be Arkansas resident, active in the Reserve of the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force or Coast Guard.</p>
	<p><b>Armed Forces Retired License Plate</b> Must be Arkansas resident who is a retired member of the United States Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, or National Guard and Reserves.</p>
	<p><b>Cold War Veteran License Plate</b> For a current or former member of the Armed Forces of the United States who served during the period of September 2, 1945 through December 26, 1991.</p>
	<p><b>Congressional Medal of Honor License Plate</b> Issued to Congressional Medal of Honor Recipients. One (1) plate issued to the eligible veteran may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.</p>
	<p><b>Disabled Veteran License Plate</b> Disabled veterans may qualify for these plates under Act 36 of 1969 as certified by the Veterans Administration (VA). An eligible veteran may receive one (1) additional plate at the fee of \$3.75. One (1) plate issued to the eligible veteran may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.</p>



**Disabled Veteran License Plate - Free**

Disabled veterans may qualify for these plates under Act 7 of 1949, or Act 30 of 1979 as certified by the Veterans Administration (VA). An eligible veteran may receive one (1) additional plate at the fee of \$3.75. One (1) plate issued to the eligible veteran may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.



**Distinguished Flying Cross Plate**

Issued to an Arkansas resident who has been awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross Medal while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, or a resident who is the surviving spouse of a Distinguished Flying Cross Medal recipient. One (1) plate issued to the eligible veteran may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.



**Ex-Prisoner Of War License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who was a prisoner of war while serving in the U.S. Armed Forces or surviving spouse.



**Gold Star Family License Plate**

The applicant must be the spouse or parent of a member of the armed forces of the United States, killed in a conflict recognized by the United States Department of Defense, and who has received a Gold Star Lapel Button issued by the United States Department of Defense.



**Korean Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of the Korean War.



**Merchant Marine Retired License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a retired veteran of the United States Merchant Marine and served during the period of October 1, 1940 through December 31, 1945.



**National Guard License Plate**

Contact your local Guard Unit.



**Operation Enduring Freedom Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of Operation Enduring Freedom.



**Operation Iraqi Freedom Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of Operation Iraqi Freedom.



**Pearl Harbor Survivor License Plate**

Issued to Arkansas residents who were a member of the US Armed Forces on December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 am to 9:45 am Hawaii time at Pearl Harbor, the Island of Oahu, or offshore at a distance not to exceed three (3) miles. One (1) plate issued to the

eligible veteran may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.



#### **Persian Gulf War Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of the Persian Gulf War.



#### **Purple Heart - Combat Wounded License Plate**

Issued to an Arkansas resident who has been awarded the Purple Heart Medal while serving in the U.S. Armed forces. One (1) plate issued to the eligible Arkansas resident may be reissued to his or her surviving spouse at the regular registration fee for the vehicle.



#### **Purple Heart Motorcycle License Plate**

Issued to an Arkansas resident who has been awarded the purple Heart medal while serving in the U.S. Armed forces, or a resident who is the unmarried surviving spouse of a Purple Heart recipient.



#### **Support Our Troops License Plate**

Issuance is restricted to passenger cars, all 1/2 ton and 3/4 ton trucks, and 1 ton trucks used for private transportation only. One (1) ton trucks used for commercial purposes must be registered with a commercial license by gross loaded weight.



#### **Veteran of Foreign Wars Motorcycle License Plate**

For initial issuance copy of membership card for Veterans of Foreign Wars and DD214 or other document evidencing their service in a theatre of operations of a war/conflict



#### **Veterans of Foreign Wars**

Issuance is restricted to passenger cars, all 1/2 ton and 3/4 ton trucks, and 1 ton trucks used for private transportation only. One (1) ton trucks used for commercial purposes must be registered with a commercial license by gross loaded weight. For initial issuance copy of membership card for Veterans of Foreign Wars and DD214 or other document evidencing their service in a theatre of operations of a war/conflict.



#### **Vietnam War Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of the Vietnam War.



#### **World War II Veteran License Plate**

Issued to any Arkansas resident who is a veteran of World War II.

### **Arkansas State Veterans Cemetery**

Eligibility requirements follow federal guidelines. State Cemetery Interment Benefits include:

- No cost for veteran interment (\$300 for spouse or qualified dependent).
- Gravesite, opening and closing of grave and perpetual care.
- Upright federal government supplied headstone or niche cover.

- A Presidential Memorial Certificate (more than one may be requested).
- A burial flag (funeral home provides).
- Military honors (funeral home makes arrangements).

To pre-register, the following forms must be provided:

1. Veteran's military discharge papers (DD-214 or equivalent).
2. Marriage License (if married).
3. Check for \$300 (spouse and dependent only) payable at the time of burial.
4. Signed cemetery pre-eligibility application. See forms on each cemetery

**ADVA Military Funeral Honors Stipend**

The procedures laid out in the Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) will enable the Arkansas Department of Veterans Affairs (ADVA) to reimburse Veterans Service Organizations (VSO) Honor Guard Teams that augment Active Duty Military Branch Honor Guard Teams as an authorized provider under the Department of

Defense MFH Authorized Provider Partnership Program (AP3) in the delivery of military funeral honors. ## **Military Discounts in Arkansas**

**2. Veterans Designation on drivers license:** Yes

**3. Discounted Fees and Taxes**

- The first \$9000 of military compensation is tax free
- Free drivers licenses and registration to current members of OIF and OEF

**4. Education Discounts** - Provides up to \$1,000 per semester for up to eight semesters of tuition assistance for ARNG members attending Arkansas public and private colleges and universities full-time. The amount is prorated for part-time students.
